## Adaptive Force Performing Arts Photo/Video/Internet policies Please read carefully

Adaptive Force Performing Arts is a place for children and adults to train and learn in a safe, friendly environment. As a part of our efforts to keep our clientele safe, as well as protect the artistic creativity of its faculty and staff, AFPA will be enforcing a strict code of conduct with regards to internet entities including, but not limited to, TikTok, Facebook, YouTube, Vimeo, Instagram, Twitter, Snapchat, etc.

By registering with AFPA, you will be required to adhere to the following:

- All choreography taught by AFPA Faculty and performed by students is property of AFPA.
- Unless otherwise stated by Mike and Amber Wittmers (AFPA owners), there is to be no videotaping of any kind during class hours.
- If you or your child posts any video of an Adaptive Force Performing Arts class, dance, or performance, without the permission or consent of the AFPA owners, you or your child could be dismissed from AFPA, forfeiting all fees paid.
- AFPA encourages you and your children to take pictures while we are performing out in the community, in between classes at conventions, preparing for a competition or at any other event AFPA takes part in. If you or your child post any photos deemed to be inappropriate or detrimental to the studio or its faculty/staff, AFPA will ask for their immediate removal. A subsequent meeting between you and/or your child and the AFPA owners will follow. This meeting will be used as a warning and any further offenses can result in immediate dismissal from AFPA.
- AFPA takes cyber-bullying very seriously. If you or your child is found to be taking part in any kind of cyber-bully, with regards to the dance studio or functions that AFPA takes part in, you and/or your child will be dismissed from AFPA, forfeiting any money paid to or owed by AFPA, no questions asked.
- When registering for AFPA, you and/or your child recognize that you are a representation of AFPA and any inappropriate photos, videos or blogs and internet postings appearing to be offensive or detrimental to AFPA, its faculty or staff will result in a meeting and potential dismissal from the studio. By registering your child or yourself with AFPA, you and/or your child's picture and/or likeness can and will be used for all advertising purposes. This includes, but is not limited to, the AFPA website, Facebook page(s), YouTube, Vimeo, Instagram, Twitter, Snapchat, TikTok, etc., as well as newspaper and magazine articles, and any other advertising materials that AFPA engages in.
